The children were so excited to make presents for Mother's Day and did well with making necklaces and cards. The children's interests now are creative art, physical play such as dancing, jumping off the plank onto the large mat, bikes ball games and being a happy helper which involves helping with the clean-up routine such as wiping tables, sweeping the floor, collecting resources from around the centre, giving out and collecting lunch tags. We are working on calming our emotions with different strategies and using our words to convey messages to our peers and educators.
